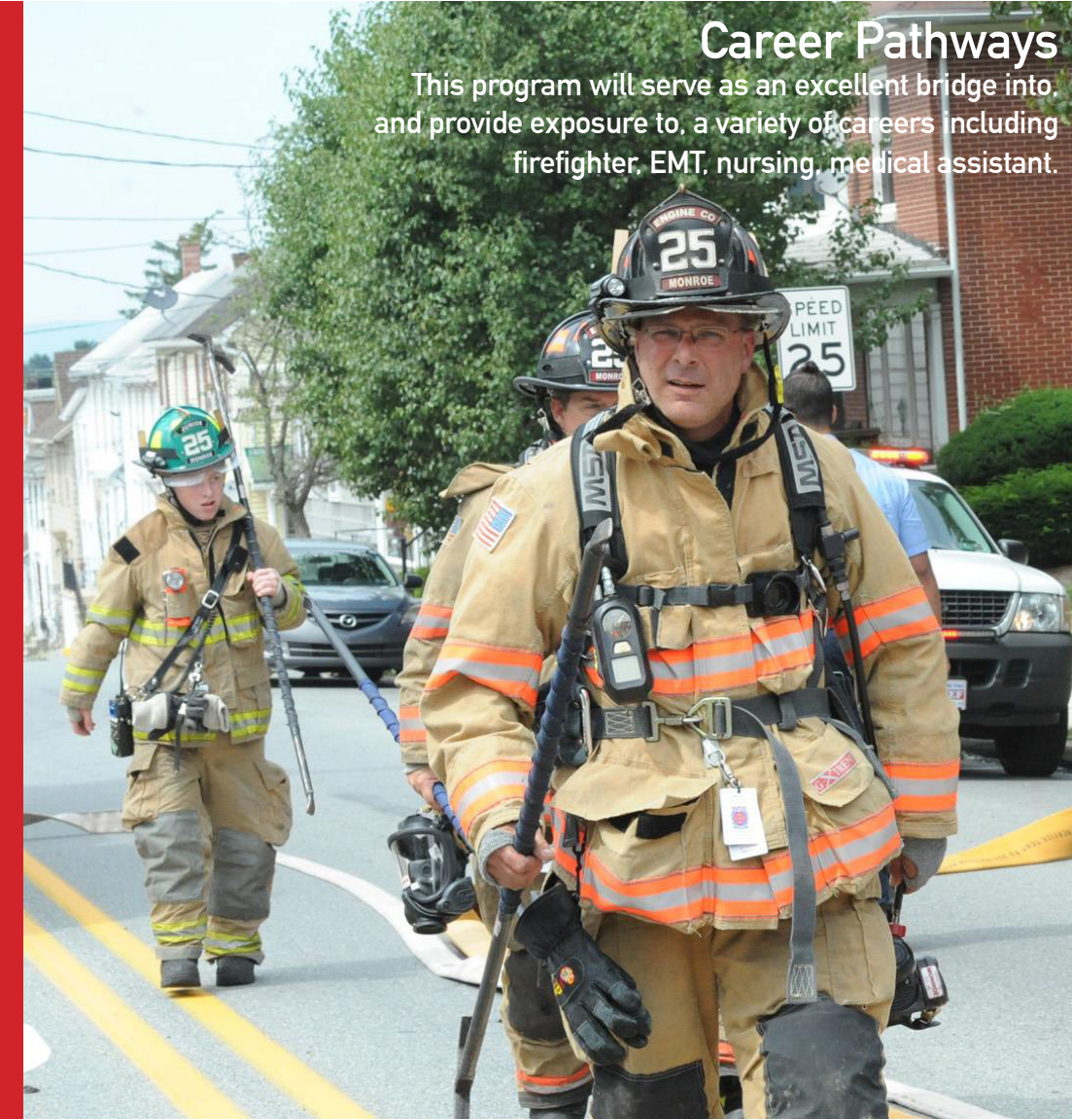


Service to the Community

Students will not only learn valuable skills, but also will have an opportunity to give back to their local fire departments and community through a minimum of 15 volunteer service hours during the Fall semester.

Career Pathways

This program will serve as an excellent bridge into, and provide exposure to, a variety of careers including firefighter, EMT, nursing, medical assistant.



Fire & Emergency Medical Responder Training Program

Cumberland Valley School District and Harrisburg Area Community College have partnered together with Hampden Township Volunteer Fire & Rescue, Monroe Fire Co., New Kingstown Fire Co., and Silver Spring Community Fire Co. to offer a dual-credit opportunity for students in grades 11 and 12.

Fall Semester: HACC Fire Training Program

This course includes classes at CV plus two Saturday sessions at a location to be determined. Students will be required to complete 15 hours of volunteer service with their local fire department. Classes are taught by a HACC instructor and supported by members and equipment from the local fire departments. Designed to equip entry level firefighters with basic knowledge, skills, and abilities. Topics will include: Introduction to Fire Service, Fire Ground Support, Hazardous Material Operations, Heartsaver First Aid/CPR/AED. Students are responsible for the cost of books for the course.

EARN: 1 CV credit (elective) + hours toward Firefighter I certification.

Spring Semester: HACC Emergency Medical Responder Program

This is a certification program through the PA Department of Health. Classes are taught by a HACC instructor and supported by members and equipment from the local fire departments. This program teaches the basic knowledge and skills necessary to provide lifesaving interventions while awaiting additional EMS response and to assist with higher level personnel at the scene and during transport. Students are responsible for the cost of books for the course.

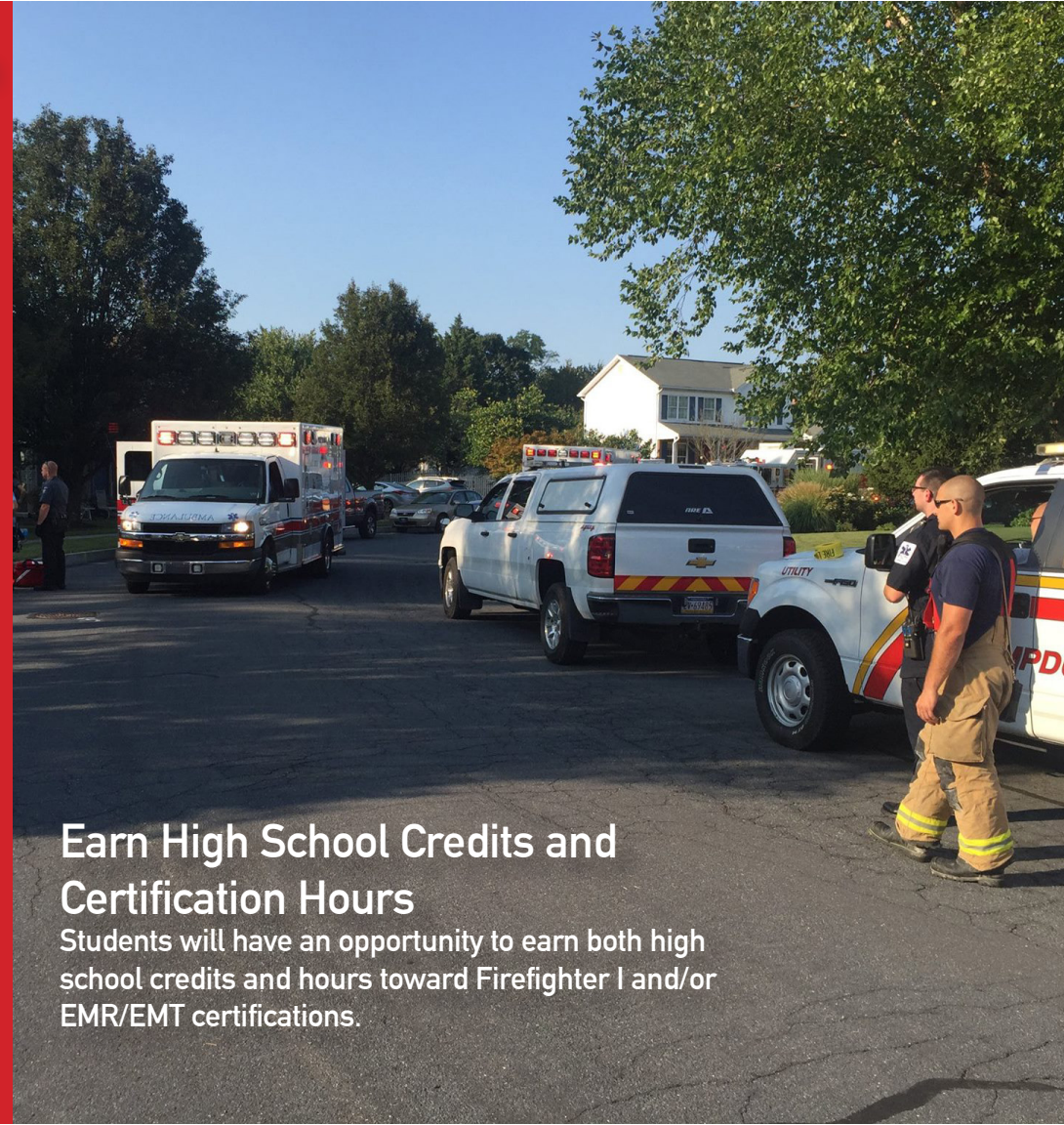
EARN: 1 CV credit (elective) + hours toward EMR/EMT program.

Summer Semester : Firefighter I and EMR to EMT Bridge Program

If students so choose, after completing the fall and spring semesters, they may continue the program by taking courses at HACC in June and July. Topics will include exterior firefighting and interior firefighting. Students age 18 and older may have an opportunity to take the Firefighter I certification exam. Additionally, this course serves as a bridge between the Emergency Medical Responder Program and the Emergency Medical Technician program. Students are responsible for all costs associated with the course.
