


Most popular mobile social networking apps in the United States as of May 2017, by monthly users (in millions)

What to do if your child is being cyberbullied

- Don't respond or forward messages
- Keep evidence: dates, times, description, screenshots
- Block the cyberbully
- Report cyberbully to school
- Report cyberbully to service provider
- Report cyberbully to police

Act 26 of 2015 Cyber Harassment of a child

- Statement of opinion about physical characteristics, sexuality, sexual activity, mental or physical health
- Third degree misdemeanor
- Referred to diversionary program

PA Teen Sexting Law

Summary Offense

For teens ages 11-17 to send a nude photo of themselves to someone else. The receiver can also be charged.

Third Degree Misdemeanor

- ➤ Knowingly share, distribute or publish electronic communication
- Have possession of or view a sexually explicit image of a minor who is 12 or older


Second Degree Misdemeanor

If minor defendant intends to intimidate, harass or coerce a minor.

Other Legal Issues

- Everything you post online, including email, can be used against you in court.
- Examples of free speech that are not protected by the 1st amendment are defamation, slander and libel ie cyberbullying

If you receive junk mail (called spam) or messages that make you feel uncomfortable, tell an adult that you trust and delete them. Don't reply to them.






Reliable?
