



WHAT TO DO IF YOU'RE THE CYBERBULLIED

- Don't respond or forward messages
- Keep evidence: dates, times, description, screenshots
- Block the cyberbully
- Tell your parents/guardians
- Report cyberbully to school
- Report cyberbully to service provider
- Report cyberbully to police

ACT 26 OF 2015

CYBER HARASSMENT OF A CHILD

- Statement of opinion about physical characteristics, sexuality, sexual activity, mental or physical health
- Third degree misdemeanor
- Referred to diversionary program

PA TEEN SEXTING LAW

Summary Offense

For teens ages 11-17 to send a nude photo of themselves to someone else. The receiver can also be charged.

Third Degree Misdemeanor

- Knowingly share, distribute or publish electronic communication
- Have possession of or view a sexually explicit image of a minor who is 12 or older

Second Degree Misdemeanor

If minor defendant intends to intimidate, harass or coerce a minor.

OTHER LEGAL ISSUES

- Everything you post online, including email, can be used against you in court.
- Examples of free speech that are not protected by the 1st amendment are defamation, slander and libel ie cyberbullying





HOW SOCIAL MEDIA CAN HELP YOUR COLLEGE APPLICATION (HUFFINGTON POST, 2013)

- Follow the schools you are interested in on social media sites. This shows your interest.
- Post photos from community service projects, share articles about news stories you are following, engage with people and organizations that interest you
- If you blog, use your profiles to promote your site.
- Use Twitter to show how creative you can be in 140 characters
- Use Instagram to highlight photography or design skills



**GAMING
ADDICTION**

SIGNS THAT YOUR ONLINE GAMING MIGHT BE A PROBLEM

- Playing for increasing amounts of time.
- Lying to family & friends about video game usage.
- Using video games to escape from real-life problems or bad feelings, as well as anxiety or depression.
- Becoming restless or irritable when attempting to stop playing video games.
- Skipping homework in order to play video games.
- Doing poorly on a school assignment or test because of time spent playing video games.
